

# KIBSD COVID-19 Screening & Protocols

## At Home COVID-19 Health Screening for KIBSD Students, Staff, and Visitors

Ask these questions at home before entering a KIBSD facility. Anyone who answers “yes” to questions #1 or #2 must not enter the school or participate in a school sport or activity. Individuals may not need to stay home if they’ve answered “yes” to question #3. See guidance below.

**1** Within the last 5 days, have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 or had a positive test for the virus?

**2** Have you had any of these symptoms in the last 24 hours?

- Fever/ Chills
- Cough
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New Loss of taste or smell
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

**3** Have you had close contact in the last 5 days with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19?

Close contact counts if you have been within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes (cumulative over 24 hrs),

**4** Are you vaccinated?

**Yes**  
STAY HOME or go home immediately if the answer is **YES** to one or more questions above.

Parents / guardians should follow the Return to School Options for anyone with COVID-19 symptoms to determine when to send students back to school. **DO NOT** send student to school with any of the above symptoms.

**Yes**

Quarantine not required. Carefully monitor for symptoms, especially if you are a close contact from a household exposure. If you remain asymptomatic, test on day 5 after your exposure. Wear a mask around others for 10 days from the date of your last close contact. Home kits or in-school testing may be offered as supplies and resources allow.

Individuals that have tested positive in the last 90 days do not need to test.

KIBSD Vaccinated Staff Close Contacts from a household exposure need to test on a daily basis if they continue to come to work. Reach out to your school nurse or admin to arrange testing.
