
**Older Business:**

**Summer Activity Kits**

Todd shared that there are 4 extra bags from summer activity kits that families can take home after the meeting. The bags are for kindergarten, middle school, and 3rd-5th grade students.

**New Business:**

- We are funded! Todd shared Migrant Ed Program is funded this year.



- **CAMP Grant – New Kodiak College Migrant Ed Program!**

This is a potential impact on all seniors and juniors at KHS. Todd shared that all Migrant Ed students are automatically eligible for this opportunity. It will be posted in the Smores newsletter until December. For more information, please reach out to UAA.

Questions:

1. Megan Kouremetis: "Would that help with dual enrollment costs for seniors taking college classes?" Todd said no.
2. A parent asked if her child has already started taking classes with UAA and if she can still be eligible. Todd said yes, it's still worth a try.

- **Virtual Pool Punch Passes**

Todd shared that each qualifying MEP student is eligible for 3 Virtual Punch Cards. 1 Punch card equals 10 visits, totaling 30 pool visits for the school year. Todd suggested getting at least 2 punch cards and seeing how it goes. The federal programs office will be sending a list every first day of the month at 11:00 am. All the parents who requested Pool Pass in September will be added to the October Batch.

Question:

A parent asked if the 30 passes were only for the school year or the whole year 364 days. Todd didn't have an answer and will get back on that.

- **Parent Committee Volunteers**


Todd asked families if anyone wanted to join Molly Keyse as a Committee volunteer. It would be a great benefit to MEP to have another one.

- **Swim Lessons**

Todd shared that MEP will support early swimmers (Preschool beginners, Preschool Advanced, Level 1, and Level 2 swimming lessons). Each student is eligible for 2 swim lessons this year. The cost for these lessons is \$40 each.

Question:

Molly asked if she could get a reimbursement for the Level 2 lesson last summer. Todd said we could reimburse if it was paid after July 1. Princess will reach out to Pool regarding the reimbursement.



- **Lifeguard Class**

Applicants must be 15 years old or older to apply and attend. Todd stated that MEP would support this program and advised families to watch out for the next lesson to be posted by ParksandRec. The cost for this lesson is \$80.

- **Healthy Lifestyles / Extra-Curricular support \$150 allotment**

Todd shared a list of extra-curricular activities and asked parents to let us know if there's any vendor not included on the list.

New Process for requesting Allotment use:

Parents need to reach out via email or call the Federal Programs office if they want to use their allotment for any extra-curricular activity. Our office needs to confirm if the student has an active membership with MEP, and then we will email the vendors if the request is approved.

- **Added to the Agenda was the Bookfair**

This year, we will do the Bookfair for Migrants in the Spring and the IEA in the Fall. This is a new change this year suggested since our office focused on Migrant Ed recruiting in the Fall.

The meeting adjourned at 6:30 pm.
